

DANTE4PA: What does it mean?

Danube Network of Training Experts for Public Administration

- Growing network of education institutions and administrations
- Objective: strengthen administrative capacities in the Danube Region
- Mutual learning process
- Common development and joint execution of trainings
- Transnational and bottom-up approach
- Aiming at enlargement and consolidation





One important step, among other activities:

START-DANTE4PA

- Objective: A Danube Region wide implementation of the DANTE administrative capacity building approach
- 6 institutional partners from the DR
- How? Pilot trainings, networking activities, need assessment, analyses of the activities and the background in the partner countries





START DANTE4PA - Pilot training in Sibiu

<u>Topic:</u> Sustainable Development for local and regional authorities in the DR

- Three-days seminar
- about 20 participants
- Findings:

Added value: combination of sustainable development and management instruments

High level exchange of views between civil servants, academics and master students

High demand: Public management (administrative modernization, citizens' participation, ethics)









START DANTE4PA – Pilot training in Ljubljana

<u>Topic:</u> **Applied Ethics in Public Administration in the Danube Region**

- Two-days seminar
- nearly 20 participants
- Findings:

Topic of high potential: many questions and linked aspects

Dynamic and practice-oriented seminar: mixture of methods, strong implication of participants

Flexible approach is necessary: Different institutional backgrounds and competences of participants have to be taken into account








START DANTE4PA – results of the survey

Survey "Administrative Capacity Building in the Danube Region - Multinational need assessment"

Who participated?
72 persons from 11 countries

Most of them from: **Administration** 23 % **Education** 16,4% **Research** 9,8%










START DANTE4PA – results of the survey ¹⁾

- Strategic management 63,9 %
- Ethics in PA 58,3 %
- Citizens' participation 54,2 %
- Project management 51,4 %
- Local sustainable development 50 %

START DANTE4PA – Multinational needs assessment

Attempt of a global approach – As we have different sources (*meetings*, *discussions*, *survey*) the result **cannot be precisely quantified**, but shows tendencies

It seems however that the following topics are among the favourite ones:

- 1. Ethics
- 2. Change management
- 3. Project management
- 4. Strategic management
- 5. Leadership
- 6. Sustainable development
- 7. Participation
- 8. Digitalisation / E-Government

As a whole, among five fields suggested (*legal issues, management issues, financial and economic issues, social issues, political and administrative culture*), **management and legal issues** are in most demand

Transnational capacity building – challenges and potentials (1)

- Which language has to be chosen for transnational trainings?
- Different backgrounds of participants transforming a difficulty into an opportunity.



Composition of the groups: civil servants, academics, master students -> dynamic exchanges of knowledge and experience, high learning potentials

 Choose the right issue for the training: of current interest, of practical use for the participants, with an opening for further aspects





Transnational capacity building – challenges and potentials (1)

- Good mixture of methods, strong implication of participants
- Organisation of on-site trainings with local partners: efficient local and regional networks can be used to compose motived groups of learners
- Why should people attend a seminar in a transnational context?
